


Thales strengthens cybersecurity capabilities in industrial systems by opening a new centre of excellence in Canada

- Thales extends its footprint and investment in Atlantic Canada with the establishment of a new National Digital Excellence Centre (NDEC) that will serve as a keystone of the Group's worldleading cyber capabilities in North America, especially to meet the Operational Technology (OT) needs of the industry. OT leverages hardware and software to control physical processes, devices and infrastructure on an industrial site.
- The NDEC benefits from more than \$8.6 million in federal and provincial support. It is being
 established in partnership with the University of New Brunswick's (UNB) McKenna Institute
 and Ignite, the local regional economic development agency.
- The project will drive digital transformation, support New Brunswick's thriving cybersecurity innovation ecosystem and with future growth create over 110 highly-skilled jobs.



Thales today announced that it will develop a new National Digital Excellence Centre in the Cyber Centre¹ at Fredericton's Knowledge Park in Canada to strengthen its cybersecurity capabilities in industrial systems. It is the second digital hub of the Group in addition to the NDEC based in Ebbw Vale in Wales.

National Digital Excellence Centres are research and development facilities that enable small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and micro-enterprises to test and develop digital transformation

projects alongside large corporations. They are places of innovation to develop major technological breakthroughs.

The NDEC is being established in partnership with the University of New Brunswick's McKenna Institute and local economic development agency Ignite, with support from Opportunities New Brunswick (ONB) and from the Government of Canada, through the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA).

The project will include the National Digital Excellence Centre Canada (NDEC Canada), as well as Thales' Cyber Security Operations Centre (CSOC) for North America. It will be a hub of digital excellence, development and education, connecting New Brunswick to technology centres everywhere, stimulating growth in Atlantic Canada's technology sector, and boosting economic benefits in the region.

The Government of Canada, through ACOA, is supporting NDEC Canada through two projects. A contribution of over \$1.8 million will help the University of New Brunswick's McKenna Institute develop new cybersecurity and digital resilience programs to benefit and strengthen the region's small- and medium-sized businesses and educational programming. As well, a contribution of more than \$1.2 million will support Ignite in the design and establishment of the NDEC Canada facility, which will be a place for small business, academia, and the regional ecosystem at large to collaborate and develop cyber skills and partnerships.

ONB is investing up to \$5.5 million in the form of a payroll rebate over five years to support Thales' continental expansion of its UK-based NDEC in Canada and establishing its North American Cyber Security Operations Centre. It is estimated that the facility will contribute up to \$63 million in direct provincial GDP over a five-year period.
